Dress Code and Uniform Policy

Villiers is proud of its dress code. By dress code we mean, not only wearing correct uniform, but also looking smart in it. We want every student to observe this continually, conscious that every time they wear this uniform, they represent Villiers, both inside the School and when travelling to and from the School.

- Neat and tidy dress is expected. Uniform should be clean, un-creased, in good repair and should fit correctly.
- The uniform should be worn without ornamentation. Only School badges are acceptable.
- Non-uniform items may be confiscated and retained for collection by parents and /or guardians at the end of term.
- Good personal hygiene is important.
- A school tie must be worn properly, pushed up and clearly visible.
- School shoes must be worn with the uniform at all times. Runners/sports shoes, fashion shoes/boots or lightweight shoes are NOT acceptable.
- In the interest of safety, the height of shoes heels is not to exceed 25mm and skirts, if worn, should be mid-calf length.
- Hair should be clean and tidy. Hair should be of a natural colour (in the school's opinion). Hair styles at the discretion of the school. Shaved or partially shaved heads are not permitted. Hair should not interfere with teaching and learning and should not be a health and safety risk. Plain red or navy hair accessories only.
- Facial piercings/visible body piercings, tattoos, chokers, necklaces, bracelets etc. are not allowed, with the exception of one stud earring in each ear lobe. No visible makeup or nail polish. Facial hair, if worn, should be clean and tidy (in the school's opinion).
- Students may, in consultation with the Head of School, request additions to the uniform for religious or medical reasons. Additional items must be in school colours.
- The wearing of any article or item which has the potential to cause injury should not be worn during sports or sporting related activities.
- Please note that facial covering is not permitted unless acting on religious practice and/or public health / medical / HSE advice, and the basic school uniform must be worn at all times.

The full co-operation of all students, parents and guardians in implementing the school dress code and uniform policy is a requirement.

School Uniform

- Blazer:** Villiers School navy blazer with crest (mandatory for formal occasions)
- Pullover:** Navy - Villiers School Jumper with crest
- Skirt:** Navy - style 993 - mid-calf length, must be worn with red knee socks
Form VI students may wear navy knee socks.
- Trousers:** Navy - plain chino-style trousers, must be worn with navy socks
A plain black or navy belt may also be worn
Form VI students may wear coffee/tan chino-style trousers.
In warm weather, navy, chino shorts may be worn, (coffee/tan for Form VI)
- Shirt:** White - polycotton - long sleeved - stiff collar
- Tie:** Villiers School Tie



- Socks:** Red knee socks must be worn with skirt.
Form VI students may wear navy knee socks, if wearing skirt.
Navy socks must be worn with trousers.
- Shoes:** Plain black or navy leather full shoe
Form VI students may wear brown or tan leather shoe
No boots, fashion shoes or runners/sports shoes are permitted
Navy or black “deck” shoes are permitted.

Sport Uniform

Villiers Sports Uniform items, as pictured, should be worn for P.E., sports and games.



- Students are permitted to wear any navy tracksuit bottoms or other sports trousers.
- Non-uniform items in non-uniform colours are not permitted.
- A complete change of suitable clothing is required.
- Students can shower and must change back into school uniform after sport. Remember to do this promptly at the end of each P.E./ games session.
- All gear and sports equipment (e.g., hockey stick) should be named clearly.

- Alternative sports kits may be available for team sports (hockey/ rugby) at the discretion of the coach and during specified ordering periods.
